



Industry Representative of the Year Award

Society for Simulation in Healthcare

Current members of the industry sector (vendors, exhibitors, engineers, etc) may apply for or nominate another member for the Society for Simulation in Healthcare's Industry Representative of the Year Award.

The SSH Industry Representative of the Year Award is presented annually to one individual from a corporate entity who has demonstrated an extraordinary contribution of professional time, leadership, innovation, and resources which has helped to position SSH and its members to make significant impact in the field of simulation in healthcare.

In order to be considered for this award, the member (or member nominator in conjunction with the nominee) must submit to aspain@ssih.org :

1. Nomination Letter describing the nominee's fitness for the SSH Industry Representative of the Year Award. (self-nominations are acceptable) NOTE: 2-3 pages maximum
2. Curriculum Vitae
3. Additional supporting documentation regarding items such as SSH participation, healthcare simulation advocacy, healthcare simulation activities (in the applicant's field), or other industry activities that support the nomination (eg letters of recommendation, public documents, other evidence). NOTE: document length should be restricted to reasonable lengths, ie 1-2 pages maximum for letters of recommendation

Considerations for the award include (but are not limited to):

- Participation and collaboration in SSH initiatives
- Healthcare simulation advocacy efforts
- Contributions to healthcare simulation methodology and growth
- Design and development process of industry initiatives
- Impact of the industry initiatives
- Demonstrated clinical teaching and technological significance
- Solved an outstanding need or problem (within healthcare simulation)

A subcommittee of the SSH Corporate Roundtable with additional representation reviews and recommends an individual to the SSH Board of Directors; the Board makes a final decision. The award is presented at the annual International Meeting on Simulation in Healthcare (IMSH) at the Diamond Ball.
